• Project Cafe: We love Project Café purely for the soups they offer that change daily, this wonderful social enterprise and gem of a cafe is situated behind the Art School in the city center(ish). Come here for some wholesome™ content. • Papercup: A classic, located on Great Western Road, papercup do a tasty cup of coffee and offer delicious food too, perfect for a coffee break in between lectures.

• The Glasgow Vintage shop (GWR): Sandwiched between two veg shops on Great Western Road, the Glasgow Vintage Shop is a stellar location to engage in \sim some (probably) heal thy retail therapy, they also offer a 10% student discount if you have your uni ID with you. • Salvation army (Dumbarton Road): Though this particular charity shop has been picked to bits by roving students, it still offers up some gems every now and then. It's also the perfect place to pick up a sofa or bookshelf for your flat that you've just found out is unfurnished, or a lovely piece of artwork to brighten up your prison of a Murano room. • Glad Rags/Cafe: The Glad Foundation supports all manner of local Scottish charities and offer free/affordable music workshops for people of all ages, not only this but they have a fantastic thrift shop (Glad Rags) which is paired with the equally as fantastic Glad

• Rum shack: One of Southside's best spots for a good cocktail, as the name implies they also have every rum under the sun.

• The Tollbooth Bar: While this pub towards the East End is most definitely more catered for the old man crowd, its got £3 Guinness and a lot of charm

• Sikorski Polish Club: A genuine hidden gem in that it is excellent and difficult to find. Polish pool players rub shoulders with skaters from the nearby Kelvingrove park with a selection of cheap Polish beer and vodka available.

• The Laurieston: A beloved Southside drinking spot. • Inn deep: Very much a student pub with some of the best dog-spotting about.

• Arlington: It's a good, warm, Woodlands pub - need more be said?

• Hug n Pint: This pub is something of an everyman: not only having a substantial bar, they also offer some of the best vegan food in town and also do live gigs.
