



Audacity is a free audio editor that is perfect for this task. You can download it from:

<https://www.audacityteam.org/download/>



Once you have Audacity installed, navigate to:
'Audio Setup' → 'Host,' and select 'Windows WASAPI'



Next, navigate to 'Recording Device,' and select the "(loopback)" version of whatever audio device you are currently using.

In this example, because I was wearing headphones, I selected the 'Headphones' option.



If everything is correct, pressing the red record button should record all of the audio from your system.

Note that this method records all audio from your computer, including any audible system and email notifications.
